What is SSI?



★ The goal of State Scholars Initiative is to **increase the number of high school students taking a rigorous course of study.**

★ To do this SSI **brings business leaders into classrooms**, where these leaders work with educators to motivate middle and high school students to take and complete a rigorous course of study.



★ The course of study is patterned after the recommendations of the **National Commission on Excellence in Education.**



Motivating students



- ★ Training business people to make presentations to 8th graders right before they select their high school courses.

- ★ Business volunteers help students understand the career options and monetary benefits of taking rigorous courses (defined in the Scholars core).



- ★ State Scholars programs provide academic support, incentives, and special recognition to SSI students. This ongoing support helps ensure student success in the more difficult courses.

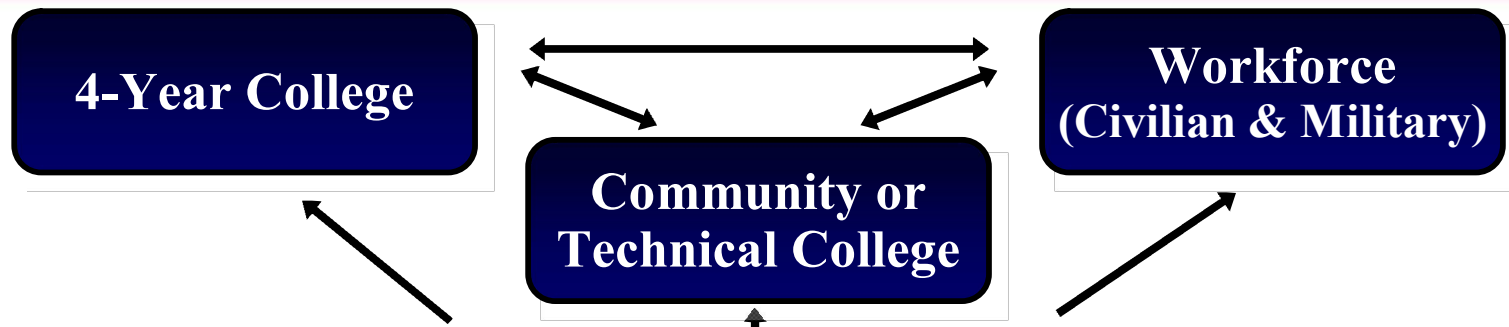

What is SSI?

- ★ The **State Scholars Initiative** is designed to help all students succeed – not just those who want a bachelor's degree.
- ★ Those who plan to enter career pathway programs at two-year colleges and technical institutes are finding they have to complete rigorous requirements for entry into programs in in-demand fields like nursing, computer science, and engineering technologies.

State Sustainability

- ★ In addition to receiving the SSI federal grant monies, business/education partnerships are asked to support the state's program through financial and in-kind contributions.
- ★ Programs need to fund:
 - training for business representatives to make effective student presentations
 - summer student academies
 - staff development for school staff
 - marketing campaigns
 - student scholarships
 - incentives and recognition events
 - long-term commitment to a statewide coordinator

Academic Competitiveness Grants

- ★ New federal student aid program for some students who qualify for Pell grants
- ★ In their first year, **\$750**
- ★ In their second year, **\$1300**
- ★ GPA of **3.0**
- ★ Rigorous course of study

RFP Process

- ★ RFP dissemination started February 6, 2006
- ★ Bidder's Conference call on February 23, 2006
- ★ Technical assistance provided until March 14, 2006 proposal deadline
- ★ Expert review panel met on March 27, 2006
- ★ State Selection between March 27-29, 2006
- ★ Announcement on March 31, 2006 to Advisory Board, states, media



Characteristics of Winning Proposals

- ★ Strong business/education partnership
- ★ Commitment to the SSI Core Course of Study
- ★ Integrate SSI with other state initiatives
- ★ Ability to manage federal grant dollars
 - ★ Including data collection on student course-taking patterns, student completion rates, and statewide policy change



Academic Competitiveness Grants

- ★ \$790 million available beginning July 1
 - ★ Includes both ACG and SMART
- ★ Pell-eligible students who are beginning their first year of college
- ★ State Education Agencies need to submit a state plan by June 1 for 2006/07 awards and November 1 for 2007/08 awards

- ★ Diana Robinson, Evaluator for WICHE
- ★ Karen Paulson, Evaluator for SSI States
 - ★ Evaluation of student course-taking patterns, student completion, and statewide policy implementation
- ★ Office of Vocational and Adult Education (OVAE), site monitoring visit June 13



Future of SSI at WICHE

- ★ Reviewed for FY 07 funding, August 2006
- ★ Possibility of a third year
 - ★ \$1.2 million for up to four more states or additional support for current 22 states
- ★ US Department of Education is deciding now on future RFP
- ★ Beyond Year 3, the sustainability of the program is unclear
