PROFESSIONAL STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAM

Guam did not fund students in PSEP during the 2023-24 academic year.

However, Guam's legislature signed Bill 158, known as the Biråda Act, on April 7, 2022. The Biråda Act supports PSEP in Guam as a way to grow its healthcare workforce. WICHE looks forward to facilitating Guam's PSEP participation starting in AY 2024-25.

For its inaugural launch

of PSEP, Guam will support students in the fields of allopathic medicine, occupational therapy, osteopathic medicine, pharmacy, and physical therapy.

Guam is a member of the U.S. Pacific Territories and Freely Associated States membership. This membership allows more students access to tuition savings, workforce development, and behavioral health programs.

Other active members include the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, the Republic of the Marshall Islands, the Federated States of Micronesia, the Republic of Palau, and American Samoa. Generous grants from the U.S. Department of Interior's Office of Insular Affairs have covered the annual dues for the Pacific Island members of WICHE for the past few years.

Regional collaboration 🧐

OUR GROWING PARTNERSHIP in the region is thanks in part to substantial collaboration and leadership, as well as a grant from the U.S. Department of Interior, Office of Insular Affairs, which was renewed for a second consecutive year in 2022 to cover WICHE's annual dues. Participation in WICHE is open to all the U.S. Pacific Territories and Freely Associated States, once they pass the necessary legislation; currently this includes American Samoa, CNMI, Guam, the Federated States of Micronesia, the Republic of the Marshall Islands, and the Republic of Palau.

WESTERN ACADEMIC LEADERSHIP ACADEMY is a yearlong professional development program for academic leaders aspiring to become chief academic officers in the WICHE region.

NO HOLDING BACK As one of 12 WICHE institutions in a community of practice in 2022-2023, the University of Guam analyzed data, policies and practices to make improvements in how it used holds on registration or transcripts, and contributed to the development of tools for other institutions to undertake this work.

WICHE staff have provided technical assistance for Guam's considerations related to authorizing off-island postsecondary institutions and potentially examining the need for participating in the **STATE AUTHORIZATION RECIPROCITY AGREEMENT (SARA)**. Additionally, WICHE continues to advocate for considering the unique challenges faced by the Pacific Islands and the need for incorporating their data in federal collections and analysis.

Sound public policy 🗎

KNOCKING AT THE COLLEGE DOOR is the leading U.S. resource for projections of college-ready students. *Knocking*, which includes a quadrennial publication with additional analysis, is essential for postsecondary policymakers, planning and workforce efforts, and economic development. DATA RESOURCES WICHE offers curated data and policy resources to support better-informed decision-making. WICHE's research projects and collaborations cover postsecondary completion, health workforce development, behavioral health in postsecondary education, open educational resources (OER), state finance, prior learning assessment, and more.

DATA EXPERTS WICHE staff provide analysis on finance, financial aid, articulation and transfer, strategic planning, student demographics, and more, as well as host peer-topeer calls of state, system, and institutional chief academic officers to identify areas of potential collaboration and resource sharing across the West.

SPECIAL PROJECTS WICHE staff continue to work with federal partners to ensure federal policy recognizes and accounts for the unique nature of the Pacific region.

Optimal behavioral healthcare 🕒

Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center (GBHWC) contracts with the WICHE BHP to facilitate development of a **DOCTORAL PSYCHOLOGY INTERNSHIP PROGRAM** to support the preparation and retention of doctoral-level psychologists in Guam. The BHP works with GBHWC to ensure the program meets the accreditation requirements of the American Psychological Association (APA), and to support the internship program through the accreditation process. The Guam-PIC graduated its first intern from the program in the 2022-23 academic year.

TOGETHER WITH VETERANS (TWV) – RURAL VETERAN SUICIDE PREVENTION PROGRAM enlists rural Veterans

and local partners to join forces to reduce Veteran suicide in their own community. Funded by the US Department of Veterans Affairs and administered by the WICHE BHP, TWV provides communities with individualized coaching, tools, training, technical assistance, and resources to implement the program in their own communities. The BHP supports 38 rural communities as far east as New Hampshire and as far west as Guam, and of those, supports 18 rural communities in the WICHE region. TWV has one site in Guam, which to date has served over 2,600 rural veterans.
