

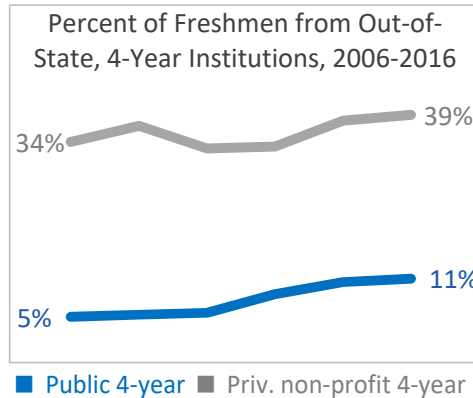
WICHE Fact Book Table 15 Supplement

This dashboard summarizes Fall semester first-time degree-seeking undergraduates (typically referred to as 'college freshmen'), and where they attend college relative to their permanent state of residence.

In 2016, 89% of First-Time Degree-Seeking Undergraduates in California Were Resident Students, 11% Were from Out-of-State

Freshmen from Out-of-State at California Public 4-Year Institutions:

- increased 210% between Fall 2006 and Fall 2016 (California resident freshmen increased 21% over the same time period).
- were 14% of all non-resident freshmen in California in Fall 2006, and 29% in Fall 2016.



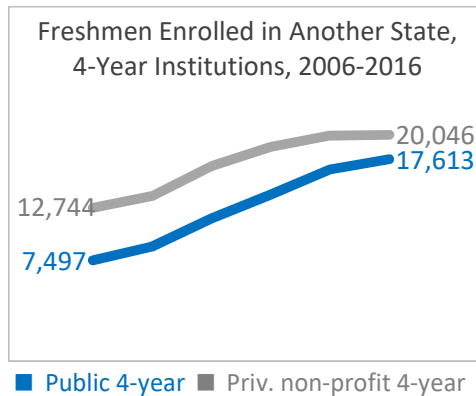

Freshmen Enrolled in Another State:

The percent of first-time undergraduates from California (with California residency) who enrolled at an institution in another state increased from 8.4% to 10.4% between 2006 and 2016.

Data are suppressed when reported enrollment was less than 10. In 2006, California Community Colleges only reported state of residence for students from California, which may impact changes over time. Some data anomalies were observed but not adjusted. *Definitions* : Includes all students enrolling within the United States among the included institutions, in Fall semester. First-time undergraduates=all first-time students entering the institution, full- or part-time, with any year of high school graduation or without a GED or high school diploma. State of residence=the permanent address identified by the student at the time of application to the institution (not necessarily the state of high school).

Fall semester college freshmen are only a portion of all of California's undergraduate students; many more students also return to continue studies each Fall, in addition to students who begin in the Spring and those not enrolled in a degree program. The data on this dashboard cover public and non-profit institutions, which have enrolled 96% or more of all undergraduates at California institutions since 2006. Several of the dashboard indicators focus on four-year institutions, because they typically encompass the majority of students who study out of state. On average each Fall, 31% of California's first-time degree-seeking undergraduates have enrolled at public and non-profit four-year institutions; 69% enrolled at public two-year institutions.
