

WICHE Fact Book Table 15 Supplement

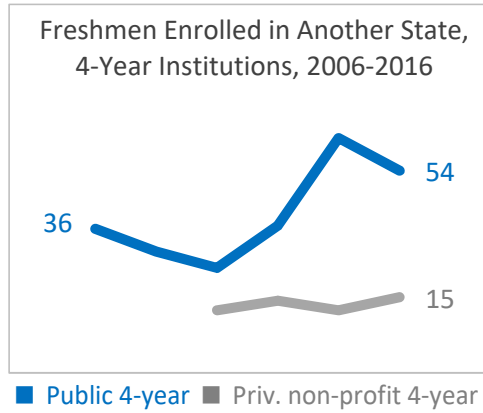
This dashboard summarizes Fall semester first-time degree-seeking undergraduates (typically referred to as 'college freshmen'), and where they attend college relative to their permanent state of residence.

The Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands has no public or private non-profit four-year institutions, and no out-of-state students were reported by Northern Marianas College after 2010.

19% of Northern Marianas Residents Who Were First-Time Freshmen in Fall 2016 Enrolled in Another State

Freshmen Enrolled in Another State:

The percent of first-time undergraduates from Northern Marianas (with Northern Marianas residency) who enrolled at an institution in another state decreased from 23.3% to 19.3% between 2006 and 2016.

Notes : Institutions included above are degree-granting, public two- and four-year and private, non-profit four-year Title IV-eligible institutions (excluding US military/service schools). Students included above are Fall semester first-time, degree-seeking undergraduates.

Data are suppressed when reported enrollment was less than 10. In 2006, California Community Colleges only reported state of residence for students from California, which may impact changes over time. Some data anomalies were observed but not adjusted. *Definitions* : Includes all students enrolling within the United States among the included institutions, in Fall semester. First-time undergraduates=all first-time students entering the institution, full- or part-time, with any year of high school graduation or without a GED or high school diploma. State of residence=the permanent address identified by the student at the time of application to the institution (not necessarily the state of high school).
