

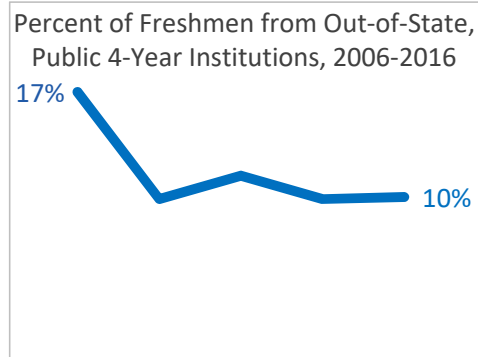
## WICHE Fact Book Table 15 Supplement

This dashboard summarizes Fall semester first-time degree-seeking undergraduates (typically referred to as 'college freshmen'), and where they attend college relative to their permanent state of residence.

### In 2016, 95% of First-Time Degree-Seeking Undergraduates in Guam Were Resident Students, 5% Were from Out-of-State

#### Freshmen from Out-of-State at Guam Public 4-Year Institutions:

- decreased 52% between Fall 2006 and Fall 2016 (Guam resident freshmen decreased 11% over the same time period).
- were 74% of all non-resident freshmen in Guam in Fall 2006, and 89% in Fall 2016.



#### Where Out-of-State Freshmen Are From

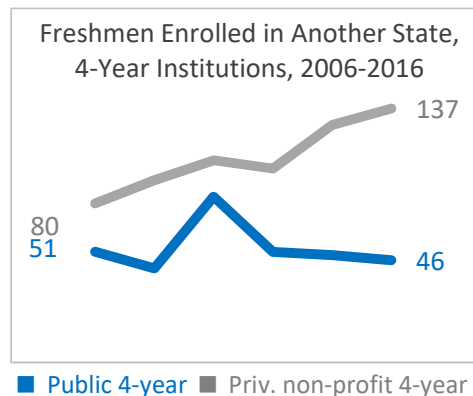

### 18% of Guam Residents Who Were First-Time Freshmen in Fall 2016 Enrolled in Another State

#### Freshmen Enrolled in Another State:

The percent of first-time undergraduates from Guam (with Guam residency) who enrolled at an institution in another state increased from 12.4% to 17.8% between 2006 and 2016.

Data are suppressed when reported enrollment was less than 10. In 2006, California Community Colleges only reported state of residence for students from California, which may impact changes over time. Some data anomalies were observed but not adjusted. *Definitions* : Includes all students enrolling within the United States among the included institutions, in Fall semester. First-time undergraduates=all first-time students entering the institution, full- or part-time, with any year of high school graduation or without a GED or high school diploma. State of residence=the permanent address identified by the student at the time of application to the institution (not necessarily the state of high school).

Fall semester college freshmen are only a portion of all of Guam's undergraduate students; many more students also return to continue studies each Fall, in addition to students who begin in the Spring and those not enrolled in a degree program. The data on this dashboard cover public and non-profit institutions, which have enrolled 100% of undergraduates at Guam institutions since 2006. Several of the dashboard indicators focus on four-year institutions, because they typically encompass the majority of students who study out of state. On average each Fall, 65% of Guam's first-time degree-seeking undergraduates have enrolled at public and non-profit four-year institutions; 35% enrolled at public two-year institutions.
