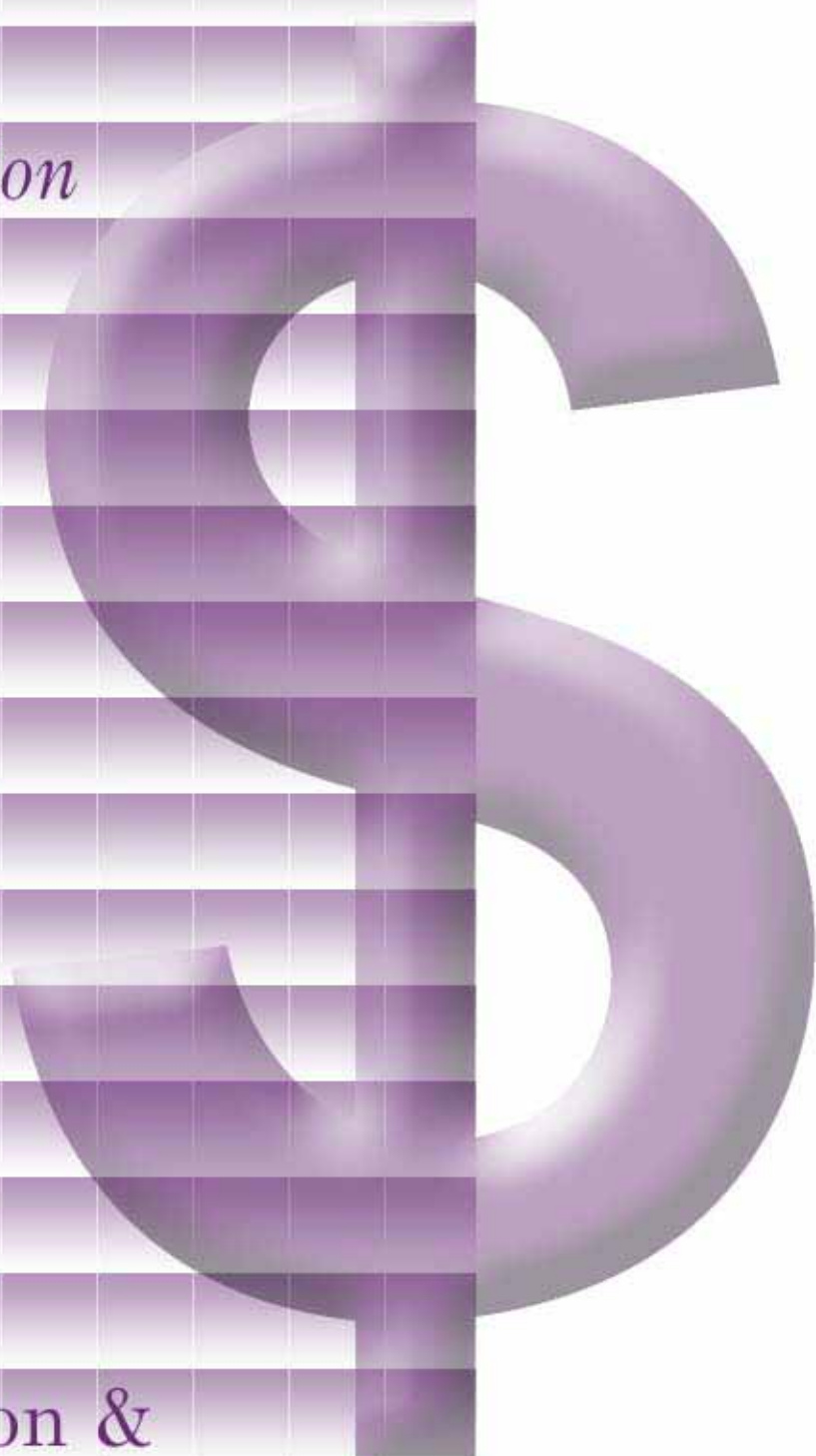

## ENDNOTES

- 2 California institutions were excluded from all calculations because the large number of two-year colleges and the historically low matriculation fee structure distort regional patterns.
- 3 This category includes only those colleges that charge a different level of tuition and fees for out-of-district residents.
- 4 The Consumer Price Index (CPI) reflects changes in the price of a fixed basket of goods and services that are purchased by consumers in general. The CPI in Table 1 is the Consumer Price Index--Urban (August to August) published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

- 6 Simple average does not include the University of Colorado Health Sciences Center.
- 7 On July 1, 1995, Oregon Health & Science University left the Oregon System of Higher Education to become an independent public corporation and set its own tuition. It is no longer reported here.

- 41 California State University nonresident tuition is \$246 per unit at semester campuses and \$164 per unit at quarter campuses. The total charge per academic year is \$7,380 plus the State University Fee and campus-based mandatory fees.
- 42 Tuition and fees for upper division undergraduates are reported; lower division undergraduate non-resident rates for 2002-03 were \$7,274.
- 43 The lower division rate for a full-time student is reported here. For academic year 2003-04, upper division students paid \$11,788 at Montana State University, Northern; \$13,231 at Montana Tech of the University of Montana; \$12,246 at the University of Montana, Missoula; and \$10,841 at Western Montana College of the University of Montana.

- 47 Coconino County Community College opened in academic year 1994-95.
- 48 In 1996-97, tuition increased at Mohave Community College and Yavapai College to bring revenues more in line with actual costs.
- 49 Northland Pioneer College increased tuition between 1987-88 and 1997-98 to be more in line with comparable institutions.
- 50 Yavapai College increased tuition in 2003-04, bringing revenues more in line with actual costs.
- 51 For 2003-04, the enrollment fee is \$18 per unit with no cap on the total. Currently, the total enrollment fee for full-time students taking 15 units per semester is \$540 per year.



- 52 Northeastern Junior College joined the Colorado Community College System in 1997-98 and Colorado Northwestern Community College joined in 1999-2000. Tuition and fees were adjusted to be consistent with other members of the Colorado Community College System. They no longer charge an out-of-district differential.
- 53 Community college tuition is charged on a per-credit basis for all enrolled credits effective academic year 2001-02. The amounts reported here are based on 12 enrolled credits per semester (24 per year). The per credit rate for AY 2002-03 was \$43; the per credit rate for AY 2003-04 is \$45.
- 54 Eastern Idaho Technical College tuition includes additional fees for computer use and student medical insurance.
- 55 Tuition includes a technology fee of \$4 per credit implemented in Spring 2000.
- 56 Great Basin College was formerly Northern Nevada Community College. Great Basin College began offering select four-year degrees in 1999-2000. The tuition reported is for full-time lower-division classes.
- 57 Tuition rates reported are for academic program students.
- 58 Since 1994-95, tuition rates reported are for academic program students.
- 59 Mesalands Community College changed its name from Mesa Technical College in Fall 2002.
- 60 New Mexico Junior College tuition was lowered in 1996-97 by agreement with the local community.
- 61 New Mexico Military Institute figures are for tuition and required fees and do not include boarding charges (all students are required to live on campus).
- 62 University of New Mexico, Taos became a branch campus effective July 2003.

- 74** Two-year institutions in these states charge the same tuition and fees for resident out-of-district/county and resident in-district/county students. See resident in-district tuition table for charges at individual institutions.
- 75** Out-of-county students in Arizona's community colleges pay in-county rates. However, each out-of-county student's county board of supervisors pays an out-of-county differential based on enrollments in prior years and the current year's rate. The figures reported in this table are the out-of-county differentials. Increases and decreases are linked to a statutory formula which causes tuition to vary from year to year.
- 76** Mohave Community College did not have any students from out-of-district counties in the years displayed; therefore, no out-of-county differential was calculated.
- 77** Aims Community College and Colorado Mountain College are the only colleges that currently have an out-of-district differential in Colorado.

## Appendix A

# The Carnegie Classification of Institutions of Higher Education, 2000

The 2000 Carnegie Classification includes all colleges and universities in the United States that are degree-granting and accredited by an agency recognized by the U.S. Secretary of Education. The 2000 edition classifies institutions based on their degree-granting activities from 1995-96 through 1997-98. For definitions and detailed information on classification procedures, refer to the [Technical Notes](#). In addition, important limitations are documented in [The 2000 Carnegie Classification: Background and Description](#).

### Doctorate-granting Institutions

**Doctoral/Research Universities—Extensive:** These institutions typically offer a wide range of baccalaureate programs, and they are committed to graduate education through the doctorate. During the period studied, they awarded 50 or more doctoral degrees per year across at least 15 disciplines.

**Doctoral/Research Universities—Intensive:** These institutions typically offer a wide range of baccalaureate programs, and they are committed to graduate education through the doctorate. During the period studied, they awarded at least ten doctoral degrees per year across three or more disciplines, or at least 20 doctoral degrees per year overall.

### Master's Colleges and Universities

**Master's Colleges and Universities I:** These institutions typically offer a wide range of baccalaureate programs, and they are committed to graduate education through the master's degree. During the period studied, they awarded 40 or more master's degrees per year across three or more disciplines.

**Master's Colleges and Universities II:** These institutions typically offer a wide range of baccalaureate programs, and they are committed to graduate education through the master's degree. During the period studied, they awarded 20 or more master's degrees per year.

### Baccalaureate Colleges

**Baccalaureate Colleges—Liberal Arts:** These institutions are primarily undergraduate colleges with major emphasis on baccalaureate programs. During the period studied, they awarded at least half of their baccalaureate degrees in liberal arts fields.

**Baccalaureate Colleges—General:** These institutions are primarily undergraduate colleges with major emphasis on baccalaureate programs. During the period studied, they awarded less than half of their baccalaureate degrees in liberal arts fields.

**Baccalaureate/Associate's Colleges:** These institutions are undergraduate colleges where the majority of conferrals are below the baccalaureate level (associate's degrees and certificates). During the period studied, bachelor's degrees accounted for at least ten percent of undergraduate awards.

### **Associate's Colleges**

These institutions offer associate's degree and certificate programs but, with few exceptions, award no baccalaureate degrees.<sup>1</sup> This group includes institutions where, during the period studied, bachelor's degrees represented less than 10 percent of all undergraduate awards.

### **Specialized Institutions**

These institutions offer degrees ranging from the bachelor's to the doctorate and typically award a majority of degrees in a single field. The list includes only institutions that are listed as separate campuses in the *2000 Higher Education Directory*. Specialized institutions include:

*Theological seminaries and other specialized faith-related institutions:* These institutions primarily offer religious instruction or train members of the clergy.

*Medical schools and medical centers:* These institutions award most of their professional degrees in medicine. In some instances, they include other health professions programs, such as dentistry, pharmacy, or nursing.

*Other separate health profession schools:* These institutions award most of their degrees in such fields as chiropractic, nursing, pharmacy, or podiatry.

*Schools of engineering and technology:* These institutions award most of their bachelor's or graduate degrees in technical fields of study.

*Schools of business and management:* These institutions award most of their bachelor's or graduate degrees in business or business-related programs.

*Schools of art, music, and design:* These institutions award most of their bachelor's or graduate degrees in art, music, design, architecture, or some combination of such fields.

*Schools of law:* These institutions award most of their degrees in law.

*Teachers colleges:* These institutions award most of their bachelor's or graduate degrees in education or education-related fields.

*Other specialized institutions:* Institutions in this category include graduate centers, maritime academies, military institutes, and institutions that do not fit any other classification category.

### **Tribal Colleges and Universities**

These colleges are, with few exceptions, tribally controlled and located on reservations. They are all members of the American Indian Higher Education Consortium.

## Appendix C

### Procedure for Converting Current Dollars To Constant Dollars

The Higher Education Price Index (HEPI), published by Research Associates of Washington, was used in Tables 3 and 4 to adjust for the effects of inflation. The base year used for the constant dollar conversions is 1993.

The formula for the constant dollar conversion is:

$$\text{Constant dollars} = \{ \text{tuition, time } t / (\text{HEPI, time } t / \text{HEPI, base year}) \}$$

For example, the procedure to convert average resident undergraduate tuition in 2003-04 shown in Table 3 to 1993 constant dollars is as follows:

$$2003-04 \text{ tuition in constant 1993 dollars} = [ \$3,468 / (\text{HEPI, time } t / \text{HEPI, base year}) ] = \$2,468$$



## Appendix D Methodology

Since 1980, WICHE has collected tuition and fees data annually from public four-year and two-year institutions in its 15 member states. The data are provided by staff at system offices or at state higher education governing and coordinating board offices. Each year, the staff are asked to provide current tuition and fees data for resident and nonresident undergraduate, graduate, and professional students in public four-year colleges and universities, and for resident and nonresident students in public two-year colleges. In addition, staff are asked to verify and, if necessary, correct previously reported data.

The 2003 survey was mailed to state governing and coordinating board staff in June 2003. Staff were asked to provide tuition and fees data for 2003-2004, and to verify and revise, if necessary, the reported data for 2002-03, 1998-99, and 1993-94. All surveys were returned by October 2003. The survey data were reviewed for possible errors, and problems were discussed with the staff in the appropriate office. This year's breakdown of institutions by Carnegie Classification used *A Classification of Institutions of Higher Education: 2000 Edition* (Carnegie Foundation, 2000).
