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

- Federal investment in adult education
 - 1966 Adult Education Act, 2014 Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act
- State vision for adult education
 - 1967 Community College Act, 1991 update brought in adult education, 2010 affirmed I-BEST as a leading strategy.





- Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (2014):
 - Create a partnership among the Federal Government, States, and localities to provide adult education and literacy activities.
