SUMMARY

Tuition and Fees in Public Higher Education in the West: 2025-26 provides comprehensive data about the tuition and fee prices published by public higher education institutions in the West for academic year (AY) 2025-26, including changes in tuition and fee rates over the past one-, five-, and 10-year periods. The tuition and fees included in this report can be viewed in an interactive dashboard and downloaded for further analysis at wiche.edu/policy-research/data-resources/tuition-fees.


Tuition and Fees at Public Four-Year Institutions

REGIONAL TRENDS

The regional average tuition and fees for resident undergraduates are \$11,693 in AY 2025-26, an increase of \$466 (4.2%) compared to AY 2024-25 (Table 1b; p. 12).² When adjusting for inflation, regional average tuition and fees increased by \$105 (0.9%) in the past year.³ Additionally:

- ► Tuition and fees for nonresident undergraduates average \$32,815 in AY 2025-26 and increased at a steeper rate (5.1%) than resident tuition and fees in the past year.
- ▶ When adjusting for inflation, average undergraduate tuition and fees decreased 0.6% since AY 2015-16 and decreased by 1.9% since AY 2020-21.

Figure 1. Regional Average Undergraduate Tuition and Fees at Public Four-Year Institutions, AY 2015-16 to AY 2025-26




STATE VARIATION IN RESIDENT UNDERGRADUATE TUITION AND FEES

Regional average tuition and fees provide a benchmark for trends in price for students and families in the region, but it is important to note that state tuition and fee trends vary significantly, including both average rates and changes in reported charges.⁴ For example:

- In AY 2025-26, state average tuition and fees for resident undergraduates range from \$7,436 to \$14,799 (Figure 2).
- ▶ Between AY 2024-25 and AY 2025-26, tuition and fees remained the same in Guam, while all other states reported an on average annual increase between 1.2% and 6.4% (see Table 3b; p. 14).
- Tuition and fees vary even more across institutions and systems within a state, as shown in Table 4a (see p. 16). For example, tuition and fees at the University of Utah are \$10,849, while tuition and fees at Utah Tech University are \$6,482.

Figure 2. State Average Resident Tuition and Fees at Four-Year Institutions, Weighted, AY 2025-26




Tuition and Fees at Public Two-Year Institutions

REGIONAL TRENDS

Average tuition and fees for resident students at public two-year institutions in the WICHE region (excluding California and Alaska) are \$4,775 in AY 2025-26 (Table 1b; p. 12). When adjusted for inflation, the AY 2025-26 resident rate increased by \$3 (0.1%) compared to the year prior (Table 2b; p. 13). Additionally:

- ▶ When including California, the regional average tuition and fees for resident students are \$2,451 in AY 2025-26, which is an increase of \$48 (2.0%) compared to AY 2024-25 (Table 1b; p. 12). Throughout this report, tuition and fees are displayed with and without California to account for the impact of California's community colleges, which enroll over 50% of the region's two-year students and charge a historically low enrollment fee.
- ► Average nonresident tuition and fees are \$12,161 (excluding California and Alaska) in AY 2025-26.
- ▶ When adjusting for inflation, regional average resident tuition and fees (including California) decreased by 12.9% from AY 2015-16. When excluding California, which has not changed its resident enrollment fee in the past decade, average tuition and fees in the region increased by 1.5% from AY 2015-16 rates.

Figure 3. Undergraduate Tuition and Fees at Public Two-Year Institutions, AY 2015-16 to AY 2025-26




STATE VARIATION IN UNDERGRADUATE TUITION AND FEES

State average tuition and fees for resident undergraduates at two-year institutions varies more widely than at four-year institutions. For example, the highest state average is over five times the lowest state average tuition and fees (Figure 4). Additional trends include:

- ▶ State average tuition and fees for resident students ranged from \$1,380 to \$7,507.
- ▶ Eight states reported no change in tuition and fees over the past year.
- ▶ Among those with a reported increase, state average tuition and fees increases ranged from 1.5% to 6% between AY 2024-25 and AY 2025-26.

Conclusion

After adjusting for inflation there was a small increase (0.9%) in resident tuition and fees at public four-year institutions in the West for AY 2025-26. Although modest, this increase is notable as it marks the second consecutive year in which tuition growth outpaced inflation, following four years of no increases since AY 2019–20. The increase is in part driven by a 5.3% increase in California, which enrolls 46% of undergraduate students in the region. Although both the University of California and California State University systems reported average increases, the California State University System reported a tuition rate increase for the second consecutive year after a decade of flat tuition rates, which resulted in an average increase of 7.3% across the system in the past year. There was no overall increase in tuition and fees after controlling for inflation when California institutions of higher education were excluded. At public two-year institutions, non-resident rates increased at a rate lower than inflation. After removing California public two-year institutions, resident tuition and fees increased at 0.1%. A forthcoming Spring 2025 WICHE Insights will explore the tuition and fees trends in more detail.

- ¹ WICHE asks respondents to report mandatory student fees as the required institutional fees that most of the lower division full-time students are required to pay in addition to tuition, not including costs for books and supplies. This report does not include fees for graduate students due to wide variability in fees across graduate programs.
- ² This report presents published tuition and fee amounts as averages both unweighted and weighted by full-time equivalent enrollments. Unlike unweighted averages, which treat each institution equally no matter how big or small it is, enrollment-weighted averages provide a truer estimate of the published price a typical student faces based on enrollment patterns. All figures included in this Summary are enrollment weighted. Appendix G provides more information regarding enrollment weighting.
- ³ Conversions to constant 2025 dollars use the Higher Education Cost Adjustment (HECA). See Appendix G for more information on HECA.
- ⁴ Throughout this report, "state" refers to state, territory, or freely associated state.
- ⁵ Alaska is excluded from the weighted regional average tuition and fees, as there are no separately accredited two-year institutions in Alaska. An unweighted average tuition and fees rate is included in Table 7a, as all students seeking an associate degree at a University of Alaska institution are charged the same lower division rates as students seeking a bachelor's degree. Throughout this report, average tuition and fees at two-year institutions are reported with and without California. California's low enrollment fee and large enrollment impact regional trends.

STATE NOTES

Alaska

TWO-YEAR INSTITUTIONS

The University of Alaska System does not have a separate community college system nor do any of the community campuses hold separate accreditation from the four-year university they are administratively connected to. Associate degree-seeking students can be found at each university and community campus. For AY 2025-26, all associate degree-seeking students pay the same lower division per-credit rate (\$241 for residents and \$841 for nonresidents) at all universities and community campuses in the UA system offering associate degrees. These rates are excluded from weighted averages.

FOUR-YEAR INSTITUTIONS

In AY 2025-26, Alaska resident students attending University of Alaska Anchorage (UAA) and the University of Alaska Southeast (UAS) are charged \$241 per-credit hour for lower division credits. Alaska resident students attending select University of Alaska Fairbanks (UAF) campuses - Rural College and Troth Yeddha' campus - are charged \$298 per-credit hour for lower division credits, with Alaska resident students attending other campuses - CTC, Bristol Bay, Chukchi, Interior Alaska, Kuskokwim, Northwest Campuses pay \$241 per lower division credit. Alaska resident students attending the University of Alaska Anchorage (UAA) and the University of Alaska Southeast (UAS) are charged \$290 per-upper-division-credit, and \$528 per-credit for graduate credits. Alaska resident students attending the University of Alaska Fairbanks (UAF) are charged \$298 per-credit for upper division courses and \$555 per-credit for graduate credits, with no limit on the number of credits. The figures reported assume a course load of 30/24 credit hours for undergraduate/graduate for two semesters. In AY 2025-26, nonresident undergraduate students pay \$841 per lower division credit hour and \$890 per-credit hour for upper division credits at University of Alaska Anchorage (UAA), University of Alaska Southeast (UAS) and the Bristol Bay, Chukchi, Interior Alaska, Kuskokwim, Northwest Campuses of University of Alaska Fairbanks (UAF). Nonresident students taking lower or upper division courses at the Rural College and Troth Yeddha' campus of UAF are charged \$898 per-credit. Nonresident students attending UAA and UAS are charged \$1,128 per-credit hour for graduate credits, while nonresident students attending UAF are charged \$1,155 for graduate credits, with no limit on the number of credits.

American Samoa

TWO-YEAR INSTITUTION

American Samoa Community College tuition and fee rates were included for the first time in AY 2024-25. Tuition and fees rates for AY 2025-26 were calculated from information provided on the institution's website.

Arizona

TWO-YEAR INSTITUTIONS

Cochise County Community College District: All amounts indicated include mandatory registration and technology fees wherever these fees are not broken out separately. Tuition and fees rates for AY 2025-26 were calculated from information provided on the institution's website.

Pima Community College: Pima Community College did not have a tuition or fee increase for FY26. Differential tuition became effective January 2012 for select courses. Reported figures are base tuition and fees.

Yavapai College: Does not charge mandatory fees. Prior to AY 2020-21 tuition rates reflected 30 credits per year and AY 2020-21 to current reflect 24 credits per year. Tuition and fees rates for AY 2025-26 were calculated from information provided on the institution's website.

Central Arizona College: Does not charge mandatory fees. Tuition rates were reduced to \$0 in AY 2020-21 and the increases since then reflect a return to a pre-COVID-19 tuition rate.

Eastern Arizona College: Does not charge mandatory fees. Tuition and fees rates for AY 2025-26 were calculated from information provided on the institution's website.

Northland Pioneer College: In AY 2020-21, a 50% tuition waiver was provided to help students during the pandemic. In AY 2021-22, the NPC District Governing Board decided to remain steady in its tuition-setting policy of 2% year-over-year increase. However, for AY 2021-22, a reduced in-district rate was set at a lower per credit amount to acknowledge resident-specific hardships.

Maricopa Community College District: In response to COVID-19, AY 2020-21 rates at institutions in the district reflect a temporary resident tuition discount for AY 2020-21. Full-time students taking 12 credits or more per semester were charged a flat rate of \$1,020 per semester. AY 2021-22 rates reflect a return to the \$85/credit charge.

FOUR-YEAR INSTITUTIONS

All Institutions: Arizona charges additional fees for certain programs: law, pharmacy, nursing, engineering, master's degree and certificate programs, and selected undergraduate degree programs.

Northern Arizona University and University of Arizona: Undergraduate resident and nonresident rates are for new student rates and reflect a Fixed Tuition Program that keep base tuition rates (and mandatory fee rates at the University of Arizona) unchanged for eight semesters.

Arizona State University: Beginning Fall 2019, ASU eliminated undergraduate program and class fees and established a college fee. The college fee for resident students ranges from \$0-\$1,800 depending on college, and \$0-\$2,600 for nonresident undergraduate students, depending on college. ASU's lower cost options at Gila Valley, Tucson, and Yuma are rural community college-based programs.

Undergraduate rates shown for ASU Polytechnic and ASU West are for freshman and sophomore students only.

University of Arizona: Beginning in AY 2024-25, the University of Arizona simplified tuition and fees for graduate students by rolling previously board-approved mandatory fees into graduate tuition and eliminating 377 graduate course fees. One mandatory fee remains, which is a legislatively enacted fee for the Arizona Financial Aid Trust.

California

TWO-YEAR INSTITUTIONS

All Institutions: AY 2024-25 resident fees were computed by WICHE using the \$46 per-unit enrollment fee. In accordance with Education Code Section 76300, the enrollment fee is reported in this report as a fee. Nonresident fees include the per-credit enrollment fee in addition to any capital outlay fees charged by the community college district.

A student who is a resident of another state is charged an out-of-state or nonresident charge per unit. The fee is set by each community college district and is in addition to the statewide per unit enrollment fee. A student who is a citizen or resident of a foreign country can be charged an additional nonresident fee per unit strictly for capital outlay expenditures. The fee is set by each community college district but cannot exceed actual expenditures per Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) student in the prior fiscal year and cannot exceed 50% of the regular nonresident fee. Other fees including a Health Fee (~\$15-20), Student Activities Fee (~\$5-15), Technology Fee (~\$10), or other minor fees may apply and are not represented here.

FOUR-YEAR INSTITUTIONS

California State University System: Fees at 21 out of 23 campuses increased during AY 2025-26, for a campus average fee increase of 11%. CSU nonresident tuition is \$444 per unit at semester campuses and \$296 per unit at quarter campuses based on 30 units reported for full-time undergraduate, 24 units for full-time graduate.

University of California: Effective fall 2022, tuition and certain fees are assessed to undergraduate students on a cohort basis. Charges for each entering undergraduate cohort are expected to be higher than the amounts charged to prior cohorts but remain flat for the duration of a student's enrollment, up to six years. For example, the AY 2023-24 levels for

undergraduate students reflect tuition and fees assessed to the undergraduate cohort first enrolled in AY 2023-24.

Undergraduate cohort first enrolled in AY 2024-25 are assessed \$498 (resident) and \$3,900 (non-resident) less than the levels indicated and assessed to the 2025-26 cohort. Undergraduate cohort first enrolled in AY 2023-24 are assessed \$684 (resident) and \$2,310 (non-resident) less than the levels indicated and assessed to the AY 2024-25 cohort. Undergraduate cohort first enrolled in AY 2022-23 are assessed \$648 (resident) and \$2,196 (non-resident) less than the levels indicated and assessed to the 2023-24 cohort. Undergraduate cohorts first enrolled in AY 2021-22 or earlier are assessed \$534 (resident) and \$1,806 (non-resident) less than the levels indicated and assessed to the AY 2022-23 cohort.

Undergraduate students at the University of California have been required to show proof of health insurance since fall 2001. Undergraduate totals do not include waivable health insurance fees. Health insurance fees for 2025-26: Berkeley: \$4,858; Davis: \$3,771; Irvine: \$2,846; Los Angeles: \$3,580; Merced: \$2,733; Riverside: \$2,606; San Diego: \$2,961; Santa Barbara: \$3,728; Santa Cruz: \$3,756. Graduate totals do not include health insurance rates; 2025-26 health insurance fees were the following: Berkeley: \$7,848; Davis: \$7,992; Irvine: \$6,874; Los Angeles: \$6,882; Merced: \$5,002; Riverside: \$5,578; San Diego: \$5,820; San Francisco: \$10,860; Santa Barbara: \$8,597; Santa Cruz: \$6,756.

The University of California, San Francisco: UCSF only offers graduate programs and, accordingly, does not appear on the list of undergraduate institutions.

System averages are included in Table 4 and Table 5 in addition to the state averages due to the wide variation in tuition and fees rates between the systems.

Colorado

TWO-YEAR INSTITUTIONS

All Institutions (except Aims Community College): All resident tuition rates account for the College Opportunity Fund (COF) stipend. Beginning with the AY 2005-06 academic year, Colorado implemented the College Opportunity Fund (COF). Instead of the direct appropriations to institutions, under COF all public institutions in the state receive a stipend per-credit hour on behalf of state residents who attend their institutions during the academic year as undergraduates and who apply for the voucher. Students are eligible for the COF voucher until they reach 145 credit hours of undergraduate study. The per-student allocation is set by the state's General Assembly during its budget process (cof.college-assist.org).

Aims Community College: Aims CC has local district tax standing, which means that the institution has different rates for "in-district residents," "in-state residents," and "out-of-state"

students. The values presented for resident rates are for "in-district residents." Tuition and fees rates for AY 2025-26 were calculated from information provided on the institution's website.

FOUR-YEAR INSTITUTIONS

All Institutions (except Colorado Mountain College): All resident tuition rates account for the College Opportunity Fund (COF) stipend. Beginning with the 2005-06 academic year, Colorado implemented the College Opportunity Fund (COF). Instead of the direct appropriations to institutions, under COF all public institutions in the state will receive a stipend per-credit hour on behalf of state residents who attend their institutions during the academic year as undergraduates and who apply for the voucher. Students are eligible for the COF voucher until they reach 145 credit hours of undergraduate study. The per-student allocation is set by the state's General Assembly during its budget process (cof.college-assist.org).

Colorado Mesa University: Graduate tuition rates for both resident and out of state are for Business, Teacher Education, Occupational Therapy, and Athletic Training, Sport Management, and Criminal Justice programs.

Metropolitan State University of Denver: AY 2024-25 graduate tuition and fee rates represent School of Education rates.

University of Colorado Boulder: Tuition rates reflect the four-year guarantee for new students and transfer students, continuing undergraduates have 0% increase.

University of Colorado, Colorado Springs: Upper division undergraduate students pay a higher tuition rate.

Fort Lewis College: Effective 2014, Fort Lewis College began offering a limited selection of graduate degrees. In AY 2017-18, the institution decreased nonresident graduate tuition to the rate of resident tuition.

Adams State University: In AY 2018-19 Adams State University reduced the nonresident graduate rate to be the same rate as the online graduate rate.

Colorado Mountain College: Effective 2011, Colorado Mountain College began offering a limited selection of four-year degrees. Effective 2018, Colorado Mountain College merged their bachelor's degree tuition rates to match their associate degrees.

Western Colorado University: AY 2024-25 graduate tuition and fees reflects the annual cost of the Master's in Education.

Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands

TWO-YEAR INSTITUTION

Northern Marianas College: According to the Carnegie Classifications, NMC is classified as a Baccalaureate/Associates institution, but it is reported here as a two-year institution because its undergraduate instructional program is primarily associate degrees.

Federated States of Micronesia

TWO-YEAR INSTITUTIONS

College of Micronesia-FSM tuition and fee rates were included for the first time in AY 2024-25.

Hawai'i

TWO-YEAR INSTITUTIONS

All Institutions: The amounts reported are based on 15 enrolled credits per semester (30 per year). The per-credit rates for AY 2025-26 are \$131 (resident) and \$345 (non-resident) for all campuses.

Maui Community College was renamed University of Hawai'i Maui College effective February 2010 to reflect its four-year degree offerings. However, UH Maui College will continue to be included with the community colleges for reporting purposes.

Idaho

TWO-YEAR INSTITUTIONS

College of Eastern Idaho: CEI was previously named Eastern Idaho Technical College (EITC). Starting academic year AY 2018-19, CEI implemented a per-credit tuition model with \$129 per-credit for in-state undergraduate students. The AY 2018-19 increase in in-state tuition represented a shift in tuition policy, while the per-credit cost is low, a student is charged for every credit, it no longer plateaus like the previously used model.

FOUR-YEAR INSTITUTIONS

Lewis-Clark State College: Began reporting resident and nonresident graduate tuition and fees for the first time in AY 2021-22.

Montana

TWO-YEAR INSTITUTIONS

All Institutions: Resident tuition levels represent amounts charged to residents of the local district/county supporting the institution.

Nevada

TWO-YEAR INSTITUTIONS

Tuition for College of Southern Nevada, Great Basin College and Western Nevada College is reported for full-time lower-division enrollment only. Select baccalaureate programs are offered.

While College of Southern Nevada, Great Basin College and Western Nevada College all have a Carnegie Classification of Baccalaureate/ Associate's, they are reported here as two-year institutions because they primarily award associate degrees and certificates.

FOUR-YEAR INSTITUTIONS

Nevada State University (previously Nevada State College) was included in resident and non-resident graduate tuition and fee rates for the first time in AY 2018-19.

New Mexico

TWO-YEAR INSTITUTIONS

New Mexico Junior College: Beginning in FY21, New Mexico Junior College began applying the 135-mile rule for West Texas residents. This allowed a West Texas resident within 135-mile radius of New Mexico Junior College to receive the out-of-district tuition rate instead of the out-of-state tuition rate.

Effective April 10, 2022, NMSU Carlsbad, a branch campus of New Mexico State University, changed operating status and became an independent college, recognized as Southeast New Mexico College.

FOUR-YEAR INSTITUTIONS

Northern New Mexico College: NNMC is a four-year institution that grants baccalaureate and associate degrees (and certificates as well). When categorizing NNMC among other public institutions in New Mexico, NNMC is grouped as a Comprehensive University, along with Eastern New Mexico University, Western New Mexico University, and New Mexico Highlands University. It is categorized in this report as a four-year school.

University of New Mexico: UNM main campus undergraduate and graduate resident tuition rates increased by 3% for AY 2022-23. An additional adjustment to the 15 hour and above undergraduate resident flat rate was also made in a continued effort to eliminate the existing price discount for enrollment at 15 hours or more. The first adjustment to the price discount was implemented in AY 2020-21 with the final adjustment in AY 2022-23.

Western New Mexico University: Two changes took place in the AY 2023-24 tuition and fee schedule for WNMU. The first was a change to the plateau from 15–18 credit hours to now

be 18+ credit hours. The tuition rate for 15-18 credit hours was the hourly rate at 13.5 credit hours. Starting in Fall 2022, students began paying the hourly rate per credit hour up to 18 credit hours with no additional charge above 18 credit hours. The other change was an additional book fee of \$25 per credit hour that covers the cost of all required course materials, removing the barrier of having to find and pay for textbooks prior to the first day of class.

North Dakota

TWO-YEAR INSTITUTIONS

Bismarck State College: Beginning Fall 2018 a new tuition model with differential program tuition rates eliminating all program fees and most course fees was introduced. This tuition model change includes a decrease in the nonresident tuition rate from a resident tuition rate factor of 2.67 to 1.5, with contiguous states charged residential rates, and established an international tuition rate using a resident tuition rate factor of 1.75. While the Carnegie Classification for Bismarck State College is Baccalaureate/Associates, it is reported here as a two-year institution because its undergraduate instructional program is primarily associate degrees.

FOUR-YEAR INSTITUTIONS

Mayville State University: The notebook computer fee was eliminated in AY 2016-17 (\$249 in AY 2015-16 and \$795 prior to AY 2015-16). Mayville State University tuition and fees increased 6% in AY 2019-20 due to implementation of a new tuition model eliminating all program and course fees, a 4% tuition increase and changed the international rate factor from 2.67 to 1.75. In AY 2025-26 Mayville State University reduced its international rate factor from 1.75 to 1.25.

Minot State University: The AY 2019-20 increase includes a 4% tuition rate increase along with the implementation of a new tuition model that eliminated most program and course fees.

Valley City State University: Fees include a \$798 notebook computer fee through AY 2018-19 that was reduced to \$700 for AY 2019-20. Valley City State University's nonresident rate decrease is due to its new tuition model for 2019-20 that decreases the nonresident factor from 2.67 to 1.75. Valley City State University in AY 2019-20 adjusted its international student factor from 2.67 to 1.75 as part of its new tuition model.

North Dakota State University: Beginning fall 2018 NDSU changed to a new tuition model, eliminating all program fees and most course fees. The new tuition model also reduced the nonresident tuition rate from a resident tuition factor of 1.5 to 1.2 and reduced the international tuition rate from a resident tuition factor of 2.67 to 1.75.

Dickinson State University: The AY 2019-20 increase in tuition and fees is due to implementation of a new tuition model that eliminated most program and course fees, included a 4% tuition increase and increased the tuition cap from 12 to 13 credits. In 2024-25, DSU changed its

international rate factor to 1.28, except for contiguous Canadian Provinces which are at a 1.0 factor. DSU also changed all United States resident factors to 1.0 in AY 2024-25.

University of North Dakota: In AY 2019-20 a new tuition model was implemented that eliminates most program and course fees and changed the international rate factor from 2.67 to 2.00.

Oregon

TWO-YEAR INSTITUTIONS

Southwestern Oregon Community College: District policy allows a person to obtain residency in the district after residing in the district for 90 or more days.

Umpqua Community College: Starting in AY 2023-24 tuition rates were flattened so all resident, nonresident, and international students pay the same per-credit rate.

FOUR-YEAR INSTITUTIONS

Eastern Oregon University: Nonresident students from Idaho and Washington pay resident tuition. All graduate programs at EOU are now off-campus and, therefore, do not charge fees.

Oregon Institute of Technology: The branch campus at Wilsonville assesses the same tuition but lower fees as OIT main.

Oregon State University: The branch campus at Bend assesses lower tuition for resident undergraduates and lower fees for all students.

Republic of the Marshall Islands

TWO-YEAR INSTITUTIONS

College of the Marshall Islands tuition and fee rates were included for the first time in AY 2024-25.

Republic of Palau

TWO-YEAR INSTITUTIONS

Palau Community College was included for the first time in AY 2022-23.

Undergraduate tuition and fee rates in this report are calculated using 12 credit hours per semester, consistent with the institution's definition of full-time enrollment. This differs from the 15 credit hours specified in the reporting definitions; submissions from previous years have also used 12 credit hours/semester to ensure continuity and comparability.

South Dakota

TWO-YEAR INSTITUTIONS

Lake Area Technical College: Previous years' rates have been updated to reflect a consistent reporting structure based on 15 credit hours per semester.

Western Dakota Technical College: Additional required fees may be charged for facility, technology, and program costs.

FOUR-YEAR INSTITUTIONS

All Institutions: Starting in AY 2016-17 the on-campus tuition rates at all institutions included the university support fee.

All Institutions: Nonresident undergraduates pay a rate of 150% of the undergraduate resident rate (adopted by the Board of Regents beginning fall 2006). All new undergraduate nonresidents and new transfers pay this rate except for Minnesota students, who pay the approved reciprocity rate.

South Dakota School of Mines & Technology, South Dakota State University, and the University of South Dakota: Since the end of the spring 2012 term, differential state-support tuition rates apply at these research institutions.

Utah

TWO-YEAR INSTITUTIONS

Utah State University-Moab and Utah State University-Blanding were included for the first time in AY 2020-21.

In addition to the public two-year institutions included in Tables 7 & 8 of this report, the Utah System of Higher Education includes 8 technical colleges. Prior to AY 2023-24 tuition was based on a per clock hour rate. Starting in AY 2023-24 tuition was reported on an annual basis. The unweighted average of the Utah two-year institutions is \$4,264 and when you include the technical colleges the unweighted average tuition was \$3,463 in AY 2025-26. Below are the AY 2025-26 tuition rates for the technical colleges:

FOUR-YEAR INSTITUTIONS

University of Utah: Since AY 2013-14, the reported tuition rates for residents and nonresidents reflect lower division courses only. The University of Utah charges a slightly lower rate for lower division courses. Prior to AY 2013-14, reported tuition and fees reflect an average of lower and upper division tuition rates.

The Utah System of Higher Education (USHE) allows differential tuition rates for 51 separate graduate programs. Graduate tuition and fees reported here are basic tuition and fee rates applicable to graduate programs within the USHE (not an average of the 51 separate graduate programs).

Southern Utah University: The graduate tuition and fee rates are based on the rates of its Master of Education programs.

Weber State University: The graduate tuition and fee rates are based on the rates of its Master of Criminal Justice and Education.

Utah Tech University: Effective Feb. 16, 2013, Dixie State College of Utah became Dixie State University. Effective July 1, 2022, Dixie State University became Utah Tech University.

Washington

TWO-YEAR INSTITUTIONS

All Institutions: In the state of Washington, "tuition and fees" is a statutorily defined term consisting of an "operating fee" and a "building fee." A reduction in tuition and fees enacted in 2015 was accompanied by an increase in discretionary funding appropriated by the 2015 Washington State Legislature, based on a policy that assumed there would be no reduction in the amount of funding provided to the community college system.

The nonresident tuition rates shown are the approved nonresident rate for each college. Individual colleges have authority to waive all or a part of the nonresident differential, and most of the colleges do exercise this waiver authority.

The names of Seattle's three community colleges changed to North Seattle College, South Seattle College, and Seattle Central College in September 2014.

FOUR-YEAR INSTITUTIONS

All Institutions: Washington's 2015-17 operating budget provided for tuition reductions, beginning with a 5% reduction of the operating fee the first year of the biennium for all colleges and universities and additional reductions in 2016 for the universities. Undergraduate tuition increased for the first time since 2015-16. Tuition is statutorily defined

as operating fees plus building fees, and building fees were not reduced so the reductions in tuition for 4-year institutions are less than 5%.

Central Washington University, Eastern Washington University, Evergreen State College, University of Washington, and Western Washington University: Full-time undergraduate tuition is for 45 quarter credit hours.

Washington State University: Full-time undergraduate tuition is for 30 semester credit hours.

University of Washington and Washington State University: Tuition and fee rates for branch campuses began reporting in AY 2019-20.

University of Washington: Graduate rates reflect those for Graduate Tier I.

For The Evergreen State Colleges, tuition and fees rates for AY 2025-26 were calculated from information provided on the institution's website.

Wyoming

TWO-YEAR INSTITUTIONS

All Institutions: Credit hours in excess of 15 per semester are now provided at no cost to the student. Previously, credit hours in excess of 12 credit hours were provided at no extra costs. This change impacts the annual change in tuition and fees between AY 2018-19 and AY 2019-20.

Fees for AY 2017-18 were provided by the Wyoming Community College Commission, while the total tuition and fees for AY 2016-17 reflect those published online by each campus, changes in the annual tuition and fee rate may therefore reflect actual fee changes or differences in computation method.

Fee structures changed in AY 2018-19 for several community colleges to reflect a per-credit hour fee rather than a user fee. Some colleges do not cap fees at 12 credit hours like tuition, but charge fees for a cap of 15 or higher credit hours.

Northern Wyoming Community College District: The Gillette College campus is currently in the process of being independently accredited. The rates at the Sheridan College and Gillette College campus are the same in AY 2025-26.

FOUR-YEAR INSTITUTIONS

University of Wyoming: Starting with the Fall 2023 semester, tuition has changed to a block tuition model from the per-credit-hour model. Undergraduate students enrolled in 12-18 credit hours per semester and Graduate students enrolled in 9-12 credit hours per semester

will be charged the block rates. Some programs are excluded from the block tuition rates and will be charged per-credit based on their specific tuition differential rates.

Undergraduate fees include mandatory fees, advising fees, technology fees, and the average estimate for program fees. Program fees vary between \$3 and \$26 per credit hour. Graduate fees include mandatory fees and technology fees.

APPENDIX D

The Carnegie Classification of Institutions of Higher Education, 2021

The Carnegie Classification™ has been the leading framework for recognizing and describing institutional diversity in U.S. higher education for the past five decades. Starting in 1970, the Carnegie Commission on Higher Education developed a classification of colleges and universities to support its program of research and policy analysis. Derived from empirical data on colleges and universities, the Carnegie Classification was originally published in 1973, and subsequently updated in 1976, 1987, 1994, 2000, 2005, 2010, 2015, 2018, 2021, and 2025 to reflect changes among colleges and universities. This framework has been widely used in the study of higher education, both as a way to represent and control for institutional differences, and also in the design of research studies to ensure adequate representation of sampled institutions, students, or faculty. The Carnegie Classifications used in this report reflect 2021 Carnegie Classifications as reported from IPEDS. Future editions of this report will explore the updated 2025 Carnegie Classifications.

Descriptions below were constructed using the language from the Carnegie Foundation web site for the 2021 classification schema. For full descriptions and more detailed information on classification procedures, refer to the Carnegie Classification of Institutions of Higher Education website available at <u>carnegieclassifications.acenet.edu</u>.

Doctorate-granting Institutions

Institutions were included in these categories if they awarded at least 20 research/scholarship doctoral degrees during the update year and also institutions with below 20 research/scholarship doctoral degrees that awarded at least 30 professional practice doctoral degrees in at least 2 programs in the update year. As in previous editions, these categories were limited to institutions that were not identified as Tribal Colleges or Special Focus Institutions.

Level of research activity: Doctorate-granting institutions were assigned to one of three categories based on a measure of research activity: very high research activity, high research activity, and doctoral/professional universities. It is important to note that the groups differ solely with respect to level of research activity, not quality or importance. More detail on the methodology used in determining research activity level can be found at carnegieclassifications.acenet.edu.

Master's Colleges and Universities

Institutions were included in these categories if they awarded at least 50 master's degrees but fewer than 20 research doctorates (as defined above) in the update year. Some institutions with smaller master's programs were also included (see below). As in previous

editions, these categories were limited to institutions that were not identified as Tribal Colleges or Special Focus Institutions.

Program size: Master's program size was based on the number of master's degrees awarded in 2016-17. Those awarding at least 200 degrees were included among larger programs; those awarding 100–199 were included among medium programs; and those awarding 50–99 were included among smaller programs. The smaller programs group also includes institutions that awarded fewer than 50 master's degrees if (a) their Enrollment Profile classification is Exclusively Graduate/Professional or (b) their Enrollment Profile classification is Majority Graduate/Professional and they awarded more graduate/professional degrees than undergraduate degrees.

Baccalaureate Colleges

Institutions were included in these categories if bachelor's degrees accounted for at least 50% of all undergraduate degrees and they awarded fewer than 50 master's degrees in the update year. In addition, these categories were limited to institutions that were not identified as Tribal Colleges or as Special Focus Institutions.

Among institutions where bachelor's degrees represented at least half of all undergraduate degrees, those with at least half of bachelor's degree majors in arts and sciences fields were included in the "Arts & Sciences" group, while the remaining institutions were included in the "Diverse Fields" group.

Institutions with at least one baccalaureate program that conferred more than 50% of degrees at the associate's level are divided into two Baccalaureate/Associates Colleges categories: Mixed Baccalaureate/Associate's Colleges are those that conferred more than 10% of degrees at the baccalaureate level or higher (fewer than 90% associate's degrees); Associate's Dominant institutions are those that conferred fewer than 10% of degrees at the baccalaureate level or higher (at least 90% associate's degrees). For the purpose of this publication those institutions that have a Carnegie classification of Baccalaureate/Associates Colleges are placed in the category as selected by the institution or state agency.

Associate's Colleges

For institutions that conferred associate's degrees as the highest degree level offering based on a new reporting methodology introduced in the 2015 update. First, the institutions were separated according to whether their total awards (associate's degrees and certificates), were primarily in one or a few disciplinary fields. These fields were identified according to the first four digits of the CIP code. For this publication, Associate's colleges are not further defined by the Carnegie Classifications. For further detail on the Associate's colleges classification visit: carnegieclassifications.acenet.edu.

Special Focus

The special-focus designation was based on the concentration of degrees in a single field or set of related fields, at both the undergraduate and graduate levels. Institutions were determined to have a special focus with concentrations of at least 75% of undergraduate and graduate degrees. In some cases, the percentage criterion was relaxed if an institution identified a special focus on the College Board's Annual Survey of Colleges, or if an institution's only recognized accreditation was from an accrediting body related to the special focus categories.

APPENDIX G Methodology

Since 1980, WICHE has collected tuition and fees data annually from public four- and two-year institutions in its member states and territories through a survey. The data are generally provided by staff at system offices or at state higher education governing and coordinating board offices; a small number of individual institutions provide their data directly. Each year, respondents are asked to provide current published tuition and fees data for resident and non-resident undergraduate, graduate, and professional students in public four-year colleges and universities, and for resident and non-resident students in public two-year colleges (specific instructions are provided later in this appendix). Data reflect tuition and fees for full-time students attending for the full academic year, except special sessions and summer terms. Respondents were asked to indicate tuition and mandatory fees separately. In addition, they are asked to verify and, if necessary, correct previously reported data. They also provide additional interpretive information about specific circumstances in their states or institutions that is shown in the Data Notes.

The 2025-26 survey was emailed to state and institutional staff in June 2025. Surveys were returned by October 2025. The survey data were reviewed for possible errors, and problems were discussed with the staff in the appropriate office. WICHE used the 2021 "Basic Classifications" of The Carnegie Classification of Institutions of Higher Education for breakdowns by institutional type in this edition of Tuition and Fees in the West: 2025-26. See Appendix D for more information.

Enrollment-weighting

This year's edition provides enrollment weighted averages of tuition and fees in addition to the unweighted averages. When available, WICHE used the Fall Enrollment Survey from the National Center for Education Statistics' (NCES) Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS) to determine full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollment for each public two-year and four-year institution in the West. The weighted averages used FTE enrollment by institution as the weights and FTE enrollment was calculated as equal to the full-time enrollment plus 1/3 of the part-time enrollment as reported in IPEDS for the applicable year. The AY 2025-26 and AY 2024-25 enrollment weights are set equal to the Fall 2023 FTE enrollment counts since the most recent years' enrollment data were not available before publication. Both resident and non-resident rates are weighted using the same FTE enrollment, as FTE enrollment is not able to be distinguished between residency status.

Fees

WICHE calculated average mandatory fees for each institution, state, and the region. The one-, five-, and 10-year fees rates are displayed, as well as what percent of total tuition and

fees they represent. For this survey, fees are the required institutional fees that a majority of lower-division full-time students are required to pay in addition to tuition, not including costs for books and supplies. This report does not include fees for graduate students due to wide variability in fees across graduate programs.

Inflation Adjustments

WICHE calculates constant dollar amounts using the Higher Education Cost Adjustment (HECA), calculated by SHEEO, to adjust for the effects of inflation when observing long-term trends in tuition and fees. For this year's report, historical data was calculated to 2025 dollars for the WICHE regional averages in Tables 2a and 2b. The 2025 HECA figure is preliminary at the time of publication. The procedure for converting current to constant dollars is included below.

$$TF_{Constant} = \frac{TF_{Current}}{(HECA_{Base}/HECA_{Current})}$$

For example, the procedure to convert average resident undergraduate tuition in 2020-21 shown in Table 1a, \$9,160 to 2025 constant dollars is as follows:

$$TF_{Constant} = \frac{9,160}{(83.06 / 100)}$$

where the HECA value for 2025 is 100 and the HECA value for 2020 is 83.06.
